Hebrews 11:13-16 NLT

13 All these people died still believing what God had promised them. They did not receive what was promised, but they saw it all from a distance and welcomed it. 1 Corinthians 15:51-52 NLT

51 But let me reveal to you a wonderful secret. We will not all die, but we will all be transformed! 52 It will happen in a moment, in the blink of an eye, when the last trumpet is blown. For when the trumpet sounds, those who have died will be raised to live forever. And we who are living will also be transformed.

Romans 8:29 NLT

29 For God knew his people in advance, and he chose them to become like his Son, so that his Son would be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters.

"What we see in the body of the raised Jesus is what all resurrection bodies will be like." Scot McKnight

Jesus' resurrection body:

1. Is physical and tangible and recognizable
2. Is a body that will need food
3. Is a body that will have marks from this life
4. Is a body that will have powers that seem now to be supernatural

Will there be pets in heaven?

Isaiah 11:6-8 NLT

6 In that day the wolf and the lamb will live together; the leopard will lie down with the baby goat. The calf and the yearling will be safe with the lion, and a little child will lead them all. 7 The cow will graze near the bear. The cub and the calf will lie down together. The lion will eat hay like a cow. 8 The baby will play safely near the hole of a cobra. Yes, a little child will put its hand in a nest of deadly snakes without harm.

"Here is one of the big ideas about Heaven: what God makes God perfects, and what God has made for this world will be perfected in the kingdom of God." Scot McKnight

Luke 9:2 ESV

2 and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal.

"What is the kingdom like as a society? It will be a society marked by love, by justice, by holiness, and by peace. ... [so now] practice love and justice and holiness and peace." Scot McKnight
